




2025 Budget (million KRW)





Key Research Areas

KICCE spearheads the development of future early childhood education and care (ECEC) policies through child-centered, evidence-based policy research, while serving as a research platform for ECEC policies aimed at addressing low birth rates from a life-cycle perspective.

KICCE leads the development of forward-looking childcare policies that address the evolving needs of future society.

We propose evidence-based policy solutions to tackle emerging challenges amid rapid future changes, such as population decline and regional extinction.

It is the only journal dedicated to ECEC policy research in Korea and is registered with the National Research Foundation of Korea. The journal is published three times a year.



KICCE Policy Forum on ECEC

It is a quarterly magazine consisting of 'Policy Focus,' which analyzes current issues related to ECEC policies, and 'Policy Trends,' which covers both domestic and international ECEC policies trends.
